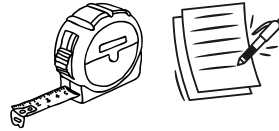


How to Measure

for Pinch Pleat Curtains

You will need a pen and paper, a tape measure, and a step-ladder if required.



Step 1 -

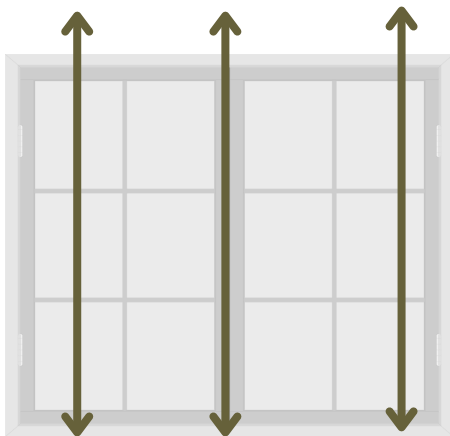
For the width, accurately measure the top of the curtain pole from end to end, excluding the decorative ends. If you have a track, simply measure the full width of the track.

Step 2 -

To measure the drop or the length of your Pinch Pleat Curtains, you will need to measure from the underside of the curtain pole rings to where you'd like your curtain to end. If you want your curtains to cover the pole, measure from the top of the curtain pole.

Step 3 -

Measure your drop on the right, middle and left, as not all windows and floors are perfectly straight.



Step 4 -

The recommended drop lengths are window sill, below sill and floor length. If you're measuring to the floor, leave a 10-15mm gap so the curtain doesn't touch the floor.
